High School Basketball Teams Suffer First Defeat of Conference Season

The Barrington high school Bronchos lost their first game of the season to the Wheat at Palatine Friday, 28-21. The Bronchos were keyed up for this game, and though they got out of a bad start, they improved on the game progress.

It was a tough contest, three or four players landing on the floor practically all the time. The Pirates, in the third quarter, in the first period, as they took a 7-0 lead. Barrington finally making 17-7 before the quarter ended.

There were a lot of fouls on both sides, but Palatine drew an advantage of the Broncho fouls. The Bronchos section in the second quarter and managed to reduce Palatine's lead to 13-8 at the half.
