

Quinn has been inducted into the Romance Writers of America Hall of Fame and was recently named the national ambassador for EveryLibrary, an organization that helps libraries fight censorship. Her novels have been translated into 41 languages and have appeared on the New York Times bestseller list 19 times.



Ruth E. Carter: Tradition, Imagination, And Costume Design Wednesday, March 20, 7 PM

Ruth E. Carter made history as the first Black person to win an Academy Award in Best Costume Design for the film *Black Panther*. She later received a second Academy Award in the same category. Carter's ability to develop an authentic story through costume and character make her one of the most sought after and renowned costume designers today. Her research and diligence to the craft of costume design shine

through in films such as Spike Lee's *Malcolm X*, Steven Spielberg's *Amistad* and Ava DuVernay's *Selma*. Carter has also received accolades and recognition from the Costume Designers Guild, Black Reel Awards, Critics' Choice Movie Awards, and American Black Film Festival, and a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.
